





5.6 Details of student counseling and career guidance

 5.02.2018. An awareness programme on UPSC and APSC Examinations was organized by the IQAC, Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the auditorium of the college, specifically meant for the 4<sup>th</sup> and the 6<sup>th</sup> semester students.

#### **Best Practice-1**

#### 1. Title of the Practice: Green Awareness Programme

2. Goal: To inculcate green habits amongst the students.

About the Programme The college celebrates World Environment Day programme every year keeping a similarity with the UN theme of the day. The college always try to spread the message through the activities organized on the special day. This year's theme was 'BEAT PLASTIC POLLUTION". Plastic has become a serious threat for the humanity. The world has generated more plastic in the last decade than the last century as a whole. 50% of the plastic used is single use plastic. To make aware of the threat of plastic use our college NSS team comprising of 15 student members delivered short speech on the bad impact of plastic and take an oath to control plastic pollution in presence of the students of two neighboring schools viz., Swamar Vidyapith & Sishu Niketon separately. Children from 9th,10th,11th standard attended the programme. Environment related quiz was organized amongst the students and COTTON BAG was given to the winner. This was a humble effort on the part of the student to arouse consciousness amongst the young generation to reduce plastic use and use cotton bag which can be reused and biodegradable. Two video clips was shown to them The students as well as the teachers of both the schools enjoyed the programme thoroughly and made a commitment to spread the message to their family members, friends and relatives.
