- The College has an Examination Conduction Committee constituted for a period of two years, which conduct all the examinations as per the University guidelines.
- The Examination Committee also conducts the internal, sessional examinations as scheduled in the academic calendar.
- Twenty percent of the total marks allotted for each of the papers are evaluated on the basis of the internal examinations, attendance, assignments, performance in group discussions etc. by the respective Departments.
- Evaluated scripts are shown to the students and necessary action is taken for improvement.

# 6.3.4 Research and Development

• DMM encourages research activity of the college teachers. Few teachers are actively

engaged in research work .The College allowed to avail FDP to one of the teachers, granted by the UGC, to undertake a doctoral research work.

# 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

• The College has a library with reading room facility for the students and teachers. Few teachers are engaged in research work utilizing the library and internet facility of the college.

# 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

• The Principal holds meetings regularly with HoDs, teaching and non teaching staff for the uplift of academic atmosphere of the college. Course plan, work load, academic calendar, lesson plan etc. are thoroughly discussed. College authority entrusts duties in different areas on the basis of their respective areas of expertise.

# 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Permanent posts of faculty members are filled by the authority according to the guidelines of the DHE. The shortage in the faculty members of respective departments are filled by contractual or part time appointments by internal selection committee.
 Non –teaching members in sanctioned posts are appointed as per Govt. rule. Non sanctioned members in temporary /ad-hoc posts are appointed by the Governing Body of the college.
