

• Three of our teacher is actively engaged in research work .One of our teacher has completed M.Phil in this academic year. One teacher is working as PhD guide. Research committee looks after the issues related to research activities of the teachers and students.

College has a central library with reading room and internet facility for the students and teachers. Every year new books are added to the library. Almost all the department has been provided with Laptop. Departments have their own library and some of the departments have internet connection. College has a future plan of providing internet connection to all the departments and teachers.



#### **Mechanism of Feedback**

The College authority used to take feedback from students to assure quality in teaching process on regular basis. The feedback forms contain different criteria for assessment of faculties. Final Semester Students used to rate the faculties on their performances on the following five point criteria. (e.g.: 5 excellent, 4. above average, 3. average, 2. below average and 1. poor) Out of the total respondent 10 students are selected from each Department depending on their attendance record and academic performances. As the college has 11 departments therefore the total sample size will be of 110 students. The authority identifies weak areas of each faculty on the basis of their ratings by the students. By emphasizing on the ratings of 'below average' and 'poor' from the responses, the college authority takes necessary action to ensure quality improvement.
