Extension Programme :

CASE STUDY IN SOWMAR VIDYAPITH SCHOOL (2009)

A case study was undertaken in SowmerVidyapith School of Digboi on 15th May 2009. The main objective of the study was to observe different developmental aspects of the students of primary section. Different developmental aspects like physical, motor, intellectual, social, emotional and language developments were found to be satisfactory among most of the students. It was also found that the teachers provide different activities to the students for their all round development.

DIET SURVEY(2009)

A diet survey was conducted at Nabajyotigaon, Pawoi on 6th June 2009. The main objectives of the survey are to highlight the socio-economic condition of the village and the dietary condition of the women. The survey was conducted by using interview method. There are

1000 households in the village out of which 20 household was selected randomly. It was revealed from the survey that the consumption of protein was less among the women of the village.

WORKSHOP ON GLASS PAINTING AND CRAFT (2009)

Workshop on Glass painting and Craft was organized on 23rd and 24th October 2009. The main objectives of the workshop were to develop creativity among the students and to give knowledge on basic techniques of glass painting and craft. A total number of 63 students participated in the workshop. The resource person invited to conduct this two day workshop was Mr. Sudip Biswas of Digboi.

FIELD VISIT TO PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE, MARGHERITA (2009)

A Field visit to Primary Health Centre, Margherita was organised on 30th October 2009 for family planning training of Adolescent girls. The objectives of the visit was to impart knowledge about different measures of family planning and maintaining reproductive health of adolescent girls.

EXHIBITION AND RANGOLI COMPITION (2009)

An Exhibition and Rangoli Compition was held on 3rd November 2009, as to show the creativity and their ability of presenting something new and extra-ordinary. There were numbers things that were being exhibited in front of the teaching staff, non-teaching staff and the students of the college.

CASE STUDY IN MORAN BLIND SCHOOL (2009)

A case study was undertaken in Moran blind school on 5th November 2009. The objective of the case study was to observe and study the visually impaired children. Total number of children in the school was around 60. The students of the school were from different parts of Assam. The school provide different facilities for the students including hostel facility. At the end of the programme chocolates and fruits were distributed among the school children.

DIET SURVEY

A diet survey was conducted at Tingrai Gaon on 28th June 2010. A chemical test for iodine deficiency was also done. The main objectives of the survey were to study the dietary condition of the women and to identify iodine deficiency among the rural women. It was found from the study that the dietary consumption pattern of the women were found satisfactory.

EXHIBITION AND COOKING COMPETITION

An exhibition and cooking competition was held in 6th September 2010. As to show the creativity and their ability of presenting something new and extra ordinary. There were numerous things that were being exhibited in front of the teaching staff, Non-teaching staff and the students of the college.

CASE STUDY IN SOUMAR VIDYAPITH SCHOOL (2010)

A case study was undertaken in SoumerVidyapith School of Digboi on 7th September 2010. The main objective of the study was to observe different developmental aspects of the students of primary section. Different developmental aspects like physical, motor, intellectual, social, emotional and language developments were found to be satisfactory among most of the students. It was also found that the teachers provide different activities to the students for their all round development.

CASE STUDY AT ANKUR, DOOMDOOMA (2010)

A case study was undertaken at Ankur(Acentre for special education for Disabled child), Hindustan uniliver Ltd., Doomdooma on 9th September 2010. The objective of the study was to observe and study the different types of exceptional children. Exceptional children refers to those whose needs are very different from those of the majority of children in the society. Special education refers to instructions that is specially designed to meet the need of exceptional children. Few of the students were mentally retarded, some were physically handicap and some of them were down syndrome. Many children coming regularly for therapy have been shown improvement and many have left after development. At the end of the programme fruits and chocolates were distributed among the school children.

FIRST AID TRAINING (2010)

The students of dept of Home Science along with us , visited IOC(AOD) hospital, Digboi on 15th and 16th September 2010. The objective of the visit was to gain practical knowledge on first aid and basic techniques of bandages. The students learnt different techniques of bandages.

WORKSHOP ON TIE AND DYE AND HAND PRINTING

A workshop on Tie and Dye and hand printing was organized on 19th November 2010. The main objectives of the workshop were to develop creativity among the students and to give knowledge on basic techniques of Tie and Dye and hand printing. The resource person invited to conduct the workshop was Dr.(Mrs) BinitaBaishyakalita of Assam Agricultural University., Jorhat.

EXCHANGE PROGRAMME ON CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

An exchange programme was organized on 26th November 2010. In this programme Mrs Lakhimi Phukan, Principal, Duliajan Girls College delivered lecture on Children with Special needs. She covered differed different areas of disabilities in her lecture. The students were very much benefited by her lecture.

EXTENSION PROGRAMME (2011)

An extension programme was organized in Tupula Basti, Digboi on 1st August to 3rd August 2011. The topic was on “Nutrition and Textile printing” The objectives of the programme were to make the rural women aware about the importance of income generating activities, to gain knowledge about health and nutrition and to share knowledge about the art of basic textile printing.

DIET SURVEY (2011)

A diet survey was conducted at Panbari Gaon on 2nd September 2011. The main objectives of the survey are to highlight the socio-economic condition of the village and the dietary condition of the women. It was revealed from the survey that the majority of the women were not so much aware of nutritional importance. It may be because of their poverty and illiteracy.

FASHION SHOW AND AN EXHIBITION

A fashion show and an exhibition were organized on 5th September 2011.

FIELD VISIT TO PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE, PANBARI

A field visit to primary health centre, Panbari on 6th September 2011 for family planning training of Adolescent girls. The objective of the visit was to impart knowledge about different measures of family planning and maintaining reproductive health of adolescent girls.

CASE STUDY IN SOWMAR VIDYAPITH SCHOOL

A case study was undertaken in Sowmer Vidyapith School of Digboi on 7th September 2011. The main objective of the study was to observe different developmental aspects of the students of primary section. Different developmental aspects like physical, motor, intellectual, social, emotional and language developments were found to be satisfactory among most of the students.

FIRST AID TRAINING

The First Aid training programme was conducted by IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi on 7th September 2011. The objective of the visit was to gain practical knowledge on first aid and basic techniques of bandages.

A REPORT ON VISIT TO SUALKUCHI (2012)

Sualkuchi is one of the most renowned village of Assam which is compared as second Manchester. It is a place of production and distribution of Silk commonly known as pat and muga fabrics of various artistic designs and patterns.

A field trip was organized to visit Sualkuchi on 11th January 2012. The main objectives of the trip was to study about the handloom textile industry and to collect different textiles designs and motifs of Assam. From the study it was found that each and every household has a single or a number of looms in the backside of their house. Majority of weavers use fly shuttle loom. In Sualkuchi the Textile production has however been essentially a feminine activity. They mainly produce Gamocha, Mekhela-chadder, erichadder, Riha, Saree, Dhoti, Shawl etc.

PARTICIPATION IN OMOLA GHAR

The students from the Department of Home science along with us visited Omola Ghar, Digboi on 17th February 2012. The objective of the visit was to participate with the children of Omolaghar. The students prepared different teaching aids for participation in nursery school. They performed different activities like rhymes, storytelling, indoor and outdoor games, creative activities etc. for the children.

EXHIBITION CUM SALE AS INCOME GENERATING ACTIVITY

An exhibition cum sale was organised by the department of home science on 4th September 2012. The objective of the exhibition was to show the creativity and to aware about income generating activities.

Extension programme

An extension programme was organized on “Food and Nutrition and Fabric Finishes in Ramnagar, Digboi on 15th – 18th October 2012. The objectives of the programme were to give knowledge about food and nutrition, to make the rural women aware about the importance of income generating activities and to share knowledge about the art of basic fabric finish techniques.

Field trip to InthameGaon, Pengeri (2013)

A field trip was organized to visit InthameGaon, Pengeri on 6th march, 2013. The main objectives of the trip was to study about the handloom textile industry and to collect different textiles deigns and motifs of Assam.

Visit to preservation centre

The students along with us visited preservation centre, Digboi on 21st and 22nd march 2013. The main objectives of the visit was to gain knowledge about different preservation techniques.

PARTICIPATION IN OMOLA GHAR

The students along with us from the Department of Home science visited OmolaGhar, Digboi from 2nd April 2013 to 9th April 2013. The objective of the visit was to participate with the children of Omolaghar. The students prepared different teaching aids for participation in nursery school. They performed different activities like rhymes, storytelling, indoor and outdoor games, creative activities etc. for the children.

The students from the Dept. of Home Science along with us , visited IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi on 7th October 2013. The objectives of the visit was to see the dietary set up of IOC (AOD) hospital and to study about different therapeutic diets for patients.

Workshop. The Workshop was inaugurated by Paban Singh Ghatowar the DONER Minister together with Former MLA of Digboi Constituency Mr. Rameshwar Dhanowar. The objectives of the workshop were to help people understand economic importance of Bamboo and to create awareness and bring enthusiasm among the youth of Assam for the development of Bamboo Industry.

UGC SPONSORED NATIONAL CONFERENCE (2014)

An UGC Sponsored National Conference on Certain Aspects on commercial Floriculture was organized by the department of Home Science on 7th and 8th March, 2014 in collaboration with NGO Anubhab Rural Development Society. Dr. Sanjita Chetia is co-ordinator in the Conference. The Conference was inaugurated by Dr. Muhammad Arif, Joint Secretary, UGC, NERO, Guwahati. The objectives of the conference was to analyse floriculture potentialities as human resource and its impact on economic development of the north east region.

Extension Programme 2014

An extension programme was held on 14th March 2014, in Balijan Borjan Gaon with the purpose to help and guide those rural people with the new techniques of "Block and Stencil Printing". The objectives of the programme were to make the rural women aware about the importance of income generating activities and to share knowledge about the art of basic textile printing.

Exhibition And Cafeteria

An exhibition and Cafeteria was held in 25th September, 2014, in the Department of Home Science. The purpose of the programme was to show the creativity and their ability of presenting something new and extra ordinary. These were in numerous things that were being exhibited in front of the teaching staff, non teaching staff and the students of the college.

Report on field trip to Jaipur (Nacte-Naga Gaon)

The students of 4th semester with major in Home Science along with us, visited Nacte-Naga Gaon on 24th April 2014. Dihingkinar Nocte village is situated at Jaipur under Dibrugarh District. The main objective of the tour was to collect different types of tribal traditional textile motifs and Textile Designs of Nacte Naga people.

The Nocte Nagas woven items include Jacket, Shawls, Bag, skirt, Blouse, loin cloth, lungi etc. the weaving designs are almost always angular or geometrical though they vary from a formal arrangement of lines and bands to an elaborate pattern of diamonds and lozenges enhanced by internal repetition and other decoration. They are loom woven as it was an age old tradition found in them.

The different woven products of Nocte Naga people are Khat Sem (Mekhela), Khathak (Gamocha), Samsong (blouse), Langti (loin cloth), etc.

Extension programme (2015)

An extension programme was held in Durgabari on 21st March 2015. The objectives of the programme were to make the civilians aware of the importance of income generating activities, to make them understand about the proper utilization of leisure time and share knowledge about the art of basic stencil and block printing method and teach them the uses of shilpakar for making toy out of it.

Field trip to Tinsukia Weaving Centre (2015)

A field trip was organized on 25th March 2015 to visit Directorate of Handloom and Textiles, Dangori branch. The objective of the field trip was to collect different Textiles Designs from the Handloom training centre.

The weaving centre was situated at Borguri, Tinsukia. 10-12 weavers were engaged in the centre. Two types of looms were used by the weavers. Those are jacquard loom and fly shuttle loom. As the fabric woven out from jacquard loom are of very fine quality, varieties of items were produced from this loom. The weavers produce different types of textile products like Gamocha, Bed cover, Stoles, blouse piece, bag, MekhlaChaddar, dining mat etc. The motifs and designs mostly used by the weavers are traditional Assamese designs. The visit had led to the development of thoughts of the students from various designs on the textile and which had helped to change the total outlook and expression of a design.

CASE STUDY AT SNEHALAYA: A CENTRE FOR REHABILITATION

The students of Department along with us visited Snehalaya, a centre for rehabilitation, Tinsukia on 25th March, 2015. The objectives of the study were to study about children with special needs and to observe different types of exceptional children. Few of them in the centre were Mentally Retarded, Some were physically handicapped and some of them were suffering from Down Syndrome.

Extension programme (2015) on Stencil and Block printing and Shilpakar

An extension programme was held in Durgabari on March 2015. The objectives of the programme were to make the civilians aware of the importance of income generating activities; to make them understand about the proper utilization of leisure time and share knowledge about the art of basic stencil and block printing method and teach them the uses of Shilpakar for making toy out of it.

Visit to IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi

The students from the Dept. of Home Science, along with us, visited IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi on 25th August 2015. The objectives of the visit was to see the dietary set up of IOC (AOD) hospital and to study about routine hospital diet given to the patients.

Case study at Mrinaljyoti Rehabilitation Centre

On 21-03-2016 students of Department of Home Science, along with us visited the Mrinaljyoti Rehabilitation Centre, Duliaganj. Mrinaljyoti rehabilitation centre is one of the premiere centres in Assam offering wide range of services with children with mental retardation, autism, cerebral palsy, multiple disabilities and hearing impaired. The objectives of the study were to study about children with special needs and to observe different types of exceptional children. The objectives of the centre is to open, run and continue an institution for the care and welfare of the mentally and physically handicapped persons/children in a healthy and amicable surrounding and to train and equip the mentally and physically handicapped so as to be supportive in an honourable and decent way of life and to develop into good, healthy and progressive citizen.

Report on collection of Different Motifs and Textile Design of Assam (2016) kakopothar

A field trip was organised on the Collection of Different Motifs and Textile Design of Assam at kakopothar on 15th March 2016. The objective of the study was to collect different motifs and textiles Designs of Moran community.

The Kakapothar weaving centre is located at Kakapothar, village Shantipur. In the weaving centre equipped with 22 throw shuttle loom. The weavers produce different items like Gamocha, mekhela Chador, cheleng chador, riha, handkerchief, lungi etc. The textile products that are used by the moran community are named as morangamocha, kaliariha, panchkothia(wrapper used by women), Du khotiya (waist band used by woman) etc. The common gamucha designs are kharuphool, Dhaturaphool, Gochphool, Tora phool etc.

The prolonged and ongoing process of Assamese and some tribal designs provide a very interesting situation that sometimes tends to change the outlook and expression of a design. Textiles produced in the family looms with beautiful eye catching designs is a prestigious and pride possession for every Assamese lady.

Extension programme (2016)

An extension programme was organised on “Healthy Cooking and Printing” in Borjan village on 19th February 2016. The objectives of the programme were to make the rural women aware about the importance of income generating activities, to make them understand about the proper utilization of leisure time and share knowledge about the art of basic stencil and block printing method.

Visit to IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi

The students from the Dept. of Home Science along with us, visited IOC (AOD) hospital, Digboi on 9th August 2016. The objectives of the visit was to see the dietary set up of IOC (AOD) hospital and to study about routine hospital diet given to the patients.

Faculty Development Programme

The Department of Home Science, DigboiMahilaMahavidyalaya Organised a three (3) days workshop on “jewelleryMaking” which began on the 15th February 2017. Students of DigboiMahilaMahavidyalaya have taken participation in this programme, which has been sponsored by the Fevicryl hobby Ideas co ordinated by Dr. SanjitaChetia Department of Home Science. The primary objective of the workshop was to build creativity among the students.

FIELD WORK TO NAMSAL, MANMO VILLAGE

A field visit was conducted for collection of different textile designs of Khamti tribe in Manmo Village, Jona-1, Namsai, Arunachal Pradesh on 17th March 2017. The objective of the field work is to study and collect different textile designs of khamti tribe. The khamti women generally used fly-shuttle looms, they weave their traditional textiles like riha, gamucha, cheleng, male lungi etc.

Case study at Ashwash Rehabilitation Centre, Dibrugarh

On 21-03-2017, We visited the Ashwash Rehabilitation Centre, Dibrugarh. Ashwash rehabilitation centre is one of the premiere centre in Dibrugarh offering wide range of services with children with mental retardation, autism, cerebral palsy, multiple disabilities and hearing impaired. The objectives of the case study were to study about children with special needs and to observe different types of exceptional children. At the end of the programme some toys made by the students, fruits, chocolates, orange juice were distributed among the school children

PARTICIPATION IN SOUMAR VIDYAPITH SCHOOL (2017)

A case study was undertaken in SoumarVidyapithSchool atDigboi on 28th March 2017. The main objective of the study was to observe different developmental aspects of the students of primary section. Different developmental aspects like physical, motor, intellectual, social, emotional and language developments were found to be satisfactory among most of the students. The students prepared different teaching aids for participation in nursery school. They performed different activities like rhymes, storytelling, indoor and outdoor games, creative activities etc. for the children.

UGC SPONSORED NATIONAL SEMINAR

An UGC Sponsored National Seminar on Indigenous food of Different communities of North –East India organized by Department of Home Science, DigboiMahilaMahavidyalaya on 8th -9th September 2017. Dr SanjitaChetia is co-ordinator of the seminar. The traditional foods prepared and processed by the women folk of the north eastern region are intimately connected to their socio-cultural, ecological, spiritual life and health. The processing and preparations of ethnic foods not only demonstrate the creativity and treasure of food heritage of tribal women but also their incremental learning to sustain the life and eco-system as a whole.

Diversities in ethnic foods made of local soyabean, bamboo shoot, tree bean, laipatta(leafy mustard), rai (Brassica juncea(Linn.)), and many other local herbs, vegetables and other indigenous ingredients need to be explored as this adds to the diverse and rich culture of north east which is still hidden from most of the people of other parts of the world.

However, in today's context, because of globalization and commercialization, many of these indigenous foods are not consumed by the general public. The children and youth of today's world are not acquainted with such foods and the ways in which they are prepared and cooked. Moreover, there is little awareness about the indigenous crops and fruits grown in these parts. Due to decrease in practices of cooking traditional food and also the lack of knowledge about the traditional dishes and lack of identifying skills for choosing wild ingredients for these foods is a major factor which is contributing towards the extinction of this valuable tradition and cultural knowledge about cooking.

EXTENSION PROGRAMME IN KULAJAN GAON, DHEMAJI

An Extension Program was organized by the department of Home Science on “Health and Hygiene” in KulajanGaon, Dhemaji on 23rd February 2019. The objective of the program were to make the rural women aware about the importance of income generating activities, to gain knowledge about health and hygiene, Block printing with vegetables, flower arrangements, window treatment. Student also performed a skit on the topic “Health and Hygiene”. At the end of the program some articles made by the students, Home Science dept. (Nighy, leaflets etc) were distributed among the village women.

REHABILITATION CENTRE, DIBRUGARH (ASHWASH)

Case study on child with special needs at “Ashwash”, Dibrugarh on 15th March 2019. Total number of children is 30; Few of them are mentally retarded, some of physically handicapped autism and some of them are down syndrome.

Exceptional children refers whose needs are very different from of those of the majority of children in society. Special educational refers to instructions that is specially designed to meet the need of exceptional children. The objective of the case study is to observe and study the different types of exceptional children many children coming regularly for therapy have been shown improvement and many have left after development and are inducted into regular school.

At the end of the programme some toys made by the students, chocolates biscuits etc were distributed among the school children

FIELD WORK TO MISHING GAON, DHEMAJI

A field work was conducted to collect different textiles designs of Missing community, in Missing DipuGaon, Dhemaji on 23rd February 2019. The village is situated 5km away from Bogibillbridge. Total no. of Household in this village is most of the women are engaged in weaving and they produced varieties of traditional costumes of Missing community. They used both throw and fly shuttle loom. Their woven products are Mibugaluk, Dumer, Erpob, Gero, Potali, ribi-gaseng etc. designs and motifs are mostly naturalistic and geometric. Most of the dresses are of multicolor with massive designs except few are of single color with simple or floral motifs from the natural surroundings.

COOKING COMPETITION

A cooking competition was held in 5th September, 2019, in the Department of Home Science. The primary purpose of the programme was to menu preparation, in the testing and evaluation of the professional theoretical knowledge and the professional skills of the students participants. The aim of the competition was to conduct contest among the students allows students to demonstrate their culinary knowledge and skills related to developing and following a recipe, preparation of dish, and displaying the dish before a judging panel where it will be evaluated on flavor, taste and palatability

Celebration of National Science Day

The national science day was observed by Department of Home Science on 28th February 2019. As we know 28th February 1928 was the great day in India when the famous Indian Physicist Sir. Chandra ShekharaVenkata Raman completed an invention in the field of Indian science. He was awarded Nobel prize in physics in 1930. To commemorate an Honour this event always in the future 28th of February was chosen by the Indian Government to designate as a National science day in India by the National Council of Science and Technology and communication in the year 1986.

PARENT TEACHERS MEET

A parent teachers meeting was held on 14th August at Department of Home Science, DigboiMahilaMahavidyalaya. The Purpose of the meeting was to keep the parents up to date about their performances. Parent teacher meeting is an opportunity to exchange observation of a student with each other. Sharing daily experience and observation provide a wider prospect for

parent and teacher to plan, prepare and execute planning for better learning outcome of a student. Total 30 nos. of parents were present on that meeting. The results of the semester was discussed with the parents and their suggestions were noted. Parents were given feedback on their performances.

VISIT TO DIETARY UNIT OF IOCL HOSPITAL DIGBOI

The students of 5th semester department of Home Science visited the Dietary unit of IOCL hospital, Digboi on 25th September 2019 to see the set up of the diet section of the hospital and to collect different information regarding therapeutic diet.

RALLY AND STREET PLAY ON 26TH SEPTEMBER

Nutrition month is celebrated on the month of September 2019 by the department of Home science. The Nutrition Month also focused on adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers to eliminate the deficiencies prevailing in the health sector. On these occasion Department of Home Science, had organized various events which focused on the importance of right food choices and developing sound eating habits

NUTRITION MONTH 27TH SEPTEMBER

Celebrate as “Rashtriya Poshan Maah” (National Nutrition Month) to emphasise the need for healthy nutrition. Nutrition month is celebrated on the month of September 2019 by the department of Home science This initiative is aimed at sensitising public on healthy eating, addressing twin issues of malnutrition and under nutrition and obesity in some sections and also intensifying existing nationwide campaign for ‘**Malnutrition-Free India**’. The month will focus on adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers to eliminate the deficiencies prevailing in the Health sector.

Extension Programme in Nogapathar

An Extension Programme was organized by the Department of Home Science in Borjan village on 13th Feb 2020. The objectives of the programme were to educate rural women about healthy lifestyles through the programme, including the basic principles of providing healthy nutrition for their families; Students also performed a skit on the topic “Health and Superstition”. At the end of the program some articles made by the student of home science department (Nightly, leaflets etc) were distributed among the village women.

Visit to Inthame

A field visit was conducted on 13th February 2020 by the department of Home Science for collection of different textile designs of Singpho community of Inthame. The main objective of the field trip was to study and collection of different textile designs of that particular community. The woman folk in spite of their busy schedule in household activities, agricultural operation and other pursuits, find time for weaving. The loom used by them are mainly simple loin loom. The artisans are very much particular about colors and have a beautiful sense of colour combinations. The designs are simple and mostly geometrical and the most common motifs are zig-zag

diamond, triangle , cross etc. They are mainly produce their traditional ress Bukang (mekhela), Nungwat or Methoni,Chinket (riha), and Men's wear Lasaba.

Celebration of National Science Day

The national science day was observed by department of home science on 28th February 2020. This day is celebrated every year on February 28 in the country to celebrate the discovery of the 'Raman Effect'. India's great scientist CV Raman invented the 'Raman Effect' on this day and won Nobel Prize for the same. This year, the theme for National Science Day 2020 is "Women in Science", which aims to appreciate the contribution of women in the field of science. The basic purpose of this day is to inspire students to new experiments, attract them to science, and make them aware of science and scientific achievements.

Faculty Development Programme

The Department of Home Science organized a 12 day short term course on Entrepreneurship Development from 12th to 31st January 2020. Teachers from different colleges of Assam have taken part in this programme which has been sponsored by the Department of Science & Technology Govt. of India. Post training assistance by way of looms, sewing machines, thread etc. are provided on successful completion of the training.

MINOR RESEARCH PROJECT

A minor project on “ A Study on Textiles of Singpho Tribes In Tinsukia District” was completed and submitted by the department of Home Science on the year 2020. The project was funded by the Digboi Mahila Mahavidyalaya. In this project the main objectives was the Study of Traditional Textiles of Singpho tribe by collecting different designs and to identify the cultural practices in relation to the dress. The cultural heritage of the Singpho is enriched by various colourful cultural components. The study deals with the investigation and documentation of the traditional costumes of Singpho community of the Tinsukia district . Three villages named Inthame, Ketetong and Dowermara were selected for the investigation. 100 samples were randomly selected for the present study . Field investigation was done personally by interview and observation through specially designed interview schedules. Wide range of Singpho traditional textiles and motifs were collected and documented. The handloom and handicrafts are intregal part of their existence.
